Outstanding Senior Citizens



Summer Electrical Assistance Available for Low-Income Households

Help is available for eligible Ohioans trying to cope with the summer heat. Under the <u>Summer Crisis Program</u>, consumers of regulated utilities may qualify to receive a benefit amount up to \$300 while customers of unregulated utilities can receive a benefit not to exceed \$500. These benefits can be used to help pay an electric bill or central air conditioning repair. Read more...



Patient Navigation for Traditional Medicare Beneficiaries

Medicare recipients have rights to free services such as requesting immediate advocacy, filing a discharge appeal, and filing a complaint about quality of care. People with traditional Medicare (the red, white, and blue patient card) may also request Patient Navigation, a short-term program to meet transitional needs for up to 60 days to help with care coordination.
