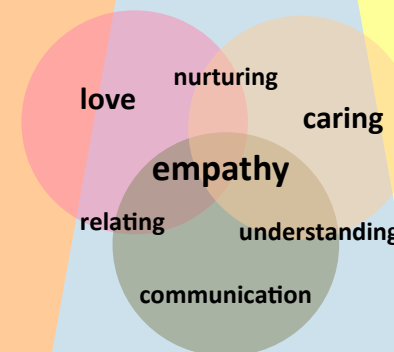

PURPOSE

Caring for aging family members can be a rewarding and gratifying experience depending on varying issues including the caregiver's own health, financial resources, emotional resilience, and whether they are also raising children.

The profile of the family caregiver in America is changing as the population ages. While the 'typical' family caregiver is a 49-year-old woman caring for a relative, caregivers on the whole are becoming as diverse as the American population.
