Area Agency on Aging, PSA 2 Continuing Education Workshop



Purpose:

According to the National Council on Aging, while older adults are roughly 16.8% of the U.S. population, they make up approximately 22% of suicides. Suicide is one of the leading causes of death in the U.S. and it is not just a preventable tragedy but a growing public health crisis. Suicide rates are higher in older adults for many reasons, including depression, grief, chronic illness, being confined to the home and loneliness.

Attendees will explore how the stigma that surrounds both aging and mental health has resulted in suicide rates among those over the age of 65 that exceed any other age demographic, what the unique warning signs among this group look like, methods to reduce older adult suicide and what resources are available locally and nationally.

Presenters:

Sandy Williams, Esq., is passionately engaged in suicide prevention and awareness activities in Ohio. After losing her father to suicide in 2011, she has been committed to removing the stigma surrounding mental health issues affecting older adults. Ms. Williams is a licensed attorney, past Chair of the Board of Directors of the Ohio Suicide Prevention Foundation and President of Jerry's Walk - Illuminating Suicide Awareness.

Veteran liaison for the Ohio Suicide
Prevention Foundation and manages the first responder Question, Persuade, and Refer (QPR) training. Mr. Hughes served in the U.S. Army for 22 years and has since channeled his passion for suicide prevention into various roles and initiatives.

- Learn how to Question, Persuade and Refer someone who may be suicidal.
